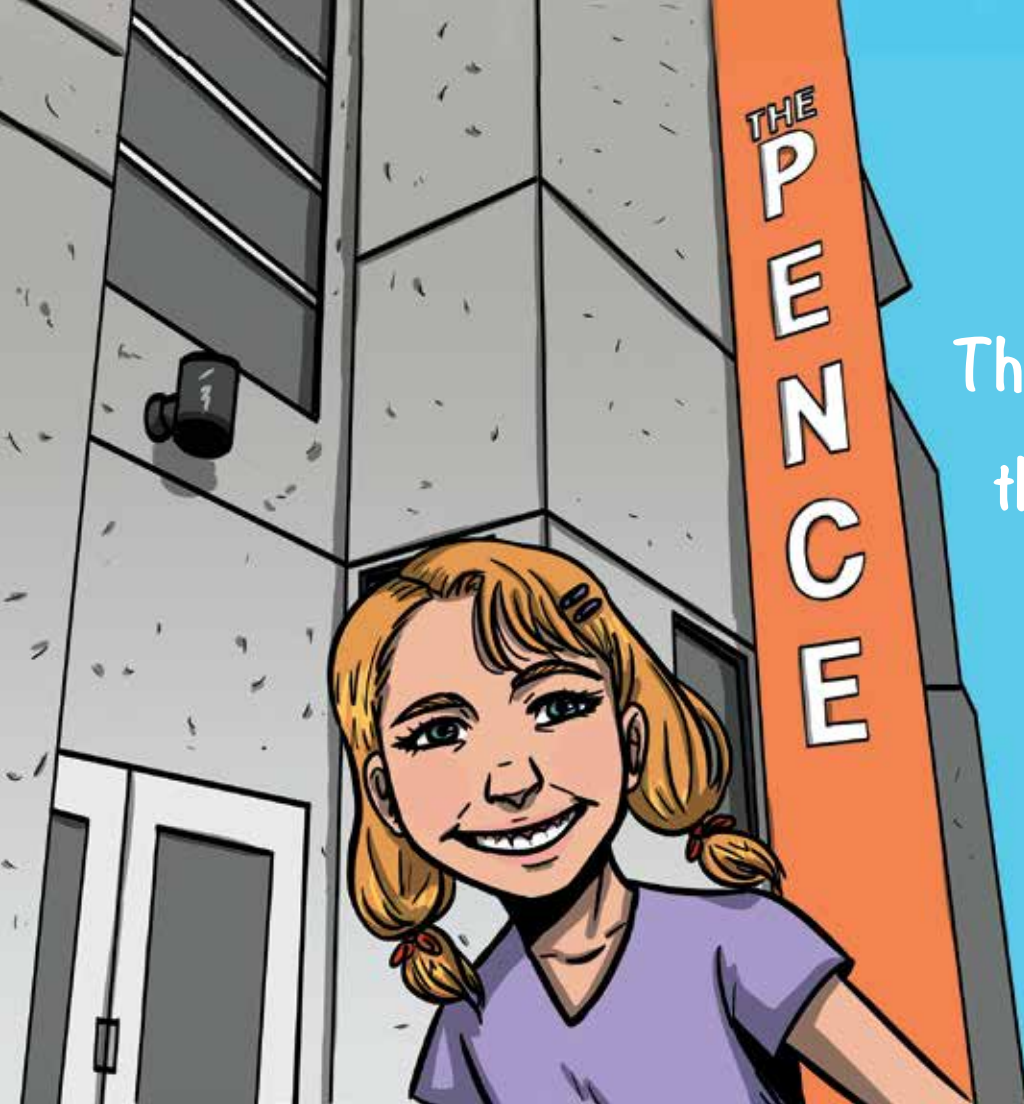

that are full of art.

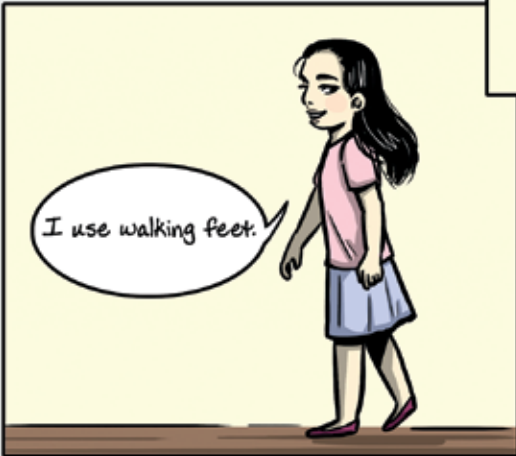
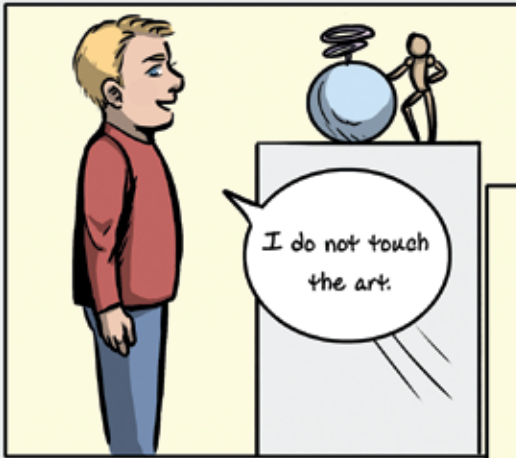


Sometimes

full of people.


If it feels too loud,

If I have a backpack,  
I leave my backpack  
at the front desk.

If I need a snack, I can use  
the outdoor areas to eat  
my snack in.

If I need help getting up  
the stairs, I use  
the elevator.







When looking  
at art I can sit  
on benches,  
I can sit  
on the floor, or  
I can stand  
next to my adult.



When I am in the Gallery

hung on the wall.

that is standing
