

PROGRAMS

The Pence weathered the storm throughout the changes mandated by Covid-19, providing more programs online than ever, such as a new afterschool ArtSmart program for children ages 6-12, and an Art History Lecture Series. The Lecture Series was very well received by patrons, and we offered five free lectures of various topics by art historians in the area. Both the afterschool art program and the Lecture Series were done virtually via Zoom, as were all of our Artist Talks. This year, we almost doubled our audience to our education programs, from 344 last year, to 646 people served.

The challenges of Covid-19 placed restrictions on our ability to host receptions, classes, and larger groups of visitors at the Gallery safely. We continued to operate as a safe, welcoming refuge for visitors to our exhibits, only one of which was cancelled due to the pandemic. Other changes included replacing the Garden Tour with a safer, smaller event called Art in the Garden. Thus our total attendance dropped from approximately 10,000 in fiscal year 2020, to a little over 7,500 this year. Much of this decline came from cancelling in person receptions.

Despite our challenges, the Pence maintained its presence through the expansion of its educational talks, lectures, and classes via online platforms such as Zoom and YouTube.



ATTENDANCE

The Pence served 7,541 people onsite and offsite, through gallery visits, programs, and events. In our youth programs, we served 223 students, parents, and teachers. We facilitated a diverse range of hands-on art workshops, talks, and demonstrations for 1,270 adults.

Through our ambitious exhibit program, we offered 240 artists an opportunity to exhibit in solo and group exhibits. As of July 1, 2021, the Pence has 343 household members. Of those members, we had 4 at the Director's Circle level, 17 at the Benefactor level, 43 at the Patron level, 84 at the Muse level, and 193 at the Art Lover level.

The Pence Gallery's service to the community is reflected in the increased number of subscribers for our YouTube channel, from 87 last year to 340 current subscribers. We produced 29 videos this year, in addition to sharing 2 videos created by artists, all of which were seen for a total of 9825 times. In all, our 57 videos have been seen a total of 28,319 times. Thank you to our members, sponsors, businesses and foundations that have provided support for the Pence Gallery over the past year.
